Clodagh Dunne, Dermot Wildes and Mark Berney, took the top prize in the intermediate group category of the *Social and Behavioural Sciences section*. Their project - *'The Effects of Waiting Environment and its contents on White Coat Hypertension'* was all about measuring the difference in blood pressure test results, when the tests were taken in different types of rooms

The students carried out studies at **Gorey Medical Centre**, with permission of Dr. Darragh O'Doherty, and also in mock clinics in the school. *'We found that environ-*

ment had a massive impact,' Clodagh said. *'We also found that males are more susceptible to white coat hypertension than females are!.'* The fact that theirs was one of the last categories to be called, meant that they awaited apprehensively for their result, and *'we were over the moon to hear that we*

were the winners in the Intermediate category.' They

Every year the Gorey Community School Music Department showcases the wealth of musical performance and dramatic talent of the student population in the *Bene Merenti* event.

This year an unprecedented 164 acts auditioned to be part of the two-night extravaganza.

Comperes **John Forrest** and **Lisa Nangle** introduced a very broad category of acts, ranging from knockout rock to sensational classical pieces, from musical medleys to time honoured Irish jigs and reels, from rousing choirs to harmonious vocal ensembles from stirring solo performance to inspiring monologue.

The exceptionally high standard of the acts electrified the audience as they rooted for the performers and cheerfully approved each piece with unbridled joy and wild applause.
